DAY 1

Upon departing the Cape Girardeau area, we will travel to Terre Haute, Indiana, where you have a guided museum tour at Clabber Girl. Clabber Girl is one of the oldest brands in America for baking. You will travel back in time seeing antique household items and kitchen appliances. Your overnight will be in Piqua, OH, and your hotel is connected to the Miami Valley Center Mall.

DAY 2

After breakfast at the hotel, depart for Greenville, Ohio, where we have a guided tour of the KitchenAid Factory to discover how the number one American-made stand mixer is made. During this one-hour walking tour, no open-toe or open-heel shoes are permitted. You will be amazed at the craftsmanship and quality involved to bring this legend to life. Lunch is included today at Montage in Greenville. Travel to Plain City, Ohio, for a tour of Phoenix Bat. Learn how to make a great bat—from wood to design right before your eyes. Overnight will be in Grove City, Ohio, after enjoying an included dinner at Schmidt's Sausage Haus, a Columbus institution.

DAY 3

After breakfast, we depart for Goumas Chocolates, where you will enjoy making your own Buckeye, the official candy of Ohio. Wow, chocolates made by you and boxed to take home. Next is a visit to Ye Olde Mill in Utica, Ohio, which is a manufacturing plant for Velvet Ice Cream. Your tour will include an ice cream cone. The complex features a restored grist mill, sits on 20 acres of beautiful grounds with a mill pond with ducks, an ice cream parlor, restaurant, gift shop and Ice Cream Museum. Traveling on, our next stop is at the American Whistle Factory. Here, safety whistles are manufactured and used by American Red Cross, police departments, NFL referees, US Air Force, Army, Navy and Marines. This factory is not air-conditioned but is well ventilated. Lastly today, we will stop to visit Ohio History Connections "1950s: Building the American Dream". Experience the 1950s through the eyes of a Central Ohio family and their porcelain steel home built around 1950. Return to the hotel in Grove City, Ohio, and enjoy the Drury's nightly "Kickback". There are restaurants next door if you are still hungry.

Our adventure today includes a stop at BeauVerre Riordan Studios, the oldest continually operating stained glass studio in the country. Learn about the various types of windows and the exclusive homes and churches that use the windows. Watch as the team creates or repairs the beautiful stained glass. Travel on to Cincinnati to visit Rookwood Factory and Market where you see the lovely and intricate designs of Rookwood Pottery and find out what makes each piece so special. If you choose not to take the hour-long tour, the Showroom Gift Shop has comfortable seating. Next, we tour the Riff Distillery in Newport, Kentucky. You will see the production and learn about the different bourbons made in Kentucky. You will check into your overnight hotel in Covington, Kentucky, and later enjoy a two-hour dinner cruise on a Queen City Riverboat with entertainment.
