Join TRINITY TRAVEL as we blaze a path eastward, with a stop at the National Museum of the Air Force. We experience the Civil War “Hallowed Ground” of Gettysburg and the Eisenhower Farm Historical Site before moving on to Philadelphia, “The City of Brotherly Love”, where we immerse ourselves in the history of the birthplace of our independence as a nation.



DAY 1

Today we meet our fellow Trinity Travelers and journey through Illinois, Indiana, and to our destination in Dayton, OH. Lunch and dinner are on our own today. Our accommodations await us tonight at the Drury Inn & Suites.

DAY 2

Breakfast is included this morning at the hotel before we drive the short distance to the National Museum of the Air Force. View the galleries presenting military aviation history from the Wright brothers to today's stealth technology. A highlight of our tour here is the display of Air Force One planes that carried presidents from FDR to JFK. You will be able to walk through four Air Force One aircraft and see where presidents worked, ate, and slept as they traveled the world over during their presidencies. Stand in the exact location on Air Force One where President Kennedy's casket rested on the return flight from Dallas, TX to Washington, DC, and see the spot where Lyndon Johnson was sworn in as president on November 22, 1963. We have lunch on our own in the Valkyrie Cafeteria at the museum before departing for Columbus, OH, where we meet our local

guide at the German Village Society and experience what German life was like in this historic German district, just blocks from downtown Columbus. The 233-acre district provides a glimpse of how a working-class neighborhood developed and grew in the early 19th century and then was rehabilitated in the 20th century. We stop at 2 German homes and a German chocolate company, where free samples are available. This evening, we enjoy an included German dinner and entertainment at Schmidt's Restaurant und Sausage Haus. *Included Meals: Breakfast / Dinner*

DAY 3

After an included breakfast at the hotel, we make our way across Ohio and into Pennsylvania. We stop in Somerset at the Quecreek Mine rescue site and hear the amazing rescue story of coal miners who were trapped 240 feet below ground for 77 hours. Arriving in Gettysburg, we check into our hotel and freshen up before we enjoy an included dinner at the 1776 Dobbins House Tavern. The home is one of Gettysburg's oldest, most historic properties open to the public. It was built in 1776, 87 years be-

DAY 4

Our day begins with a continental breakfast at the hotel. Then it's off to the Gettysburg National Military Park Visitor's Center to view the film "A New Birth of Freedom". After the film, we have time to take in the Gettysburg Museum of the Civil War, which features relics of the Battle of Gettysburg, personalities who served in the Civil War, multi-media presentations that cover the conflict from beginning to end, and the aftermath of the Battle of Gettysburg. We also see the Gettysburg Cyclorama, depicting the final fury of the assault of Gettysburg—"Pickett's Charge". We're joined by a local battlefield guide who will take us through the battlefield, including a stop at the Soldiers' National Cemetery, where President Lincoln delivered the famous Gettysburg Address just inside the Taneytown Road entrance. After lunch on our own in the Visitor's Center cafeteria, we tour the Eisenhower National Historic Site, the home and farm of General and President Dwight D. Eisenhower and his wife, Mamie Doud Eisenhower. The farm served as a week-end retreat for the President and a meeting place for world leaders. Later this afternoon, we drive through the beautiful countryside of Lancaster County on our way to Philadelphia, PA, the "City of Brotherly Love". Philadelphia is the largest city in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, founded in 1682 by William Penn and located at the confluence of the Delaware and Schuylkill Rivers. Our first stop in Philadelphia will be at the Rocky Statue and the "Rocky Steps" - better known as the Art Museum steps and two of the most popular attractions in Philadelphia. After checking into the Hampton Inn Center City Hotel, we freshen up a bit and then walk the short distance to the Reading Terminal Market for browsing and dinner on our own. The market is Philadelphia's historic public market, where you will find mouth-watering aromas, locally grown and exotic produce, Amish specialties, a wide variety of restaurants and much more. *Included Meal: Breakfast*

DAY 5

After an included breakfast at the hotel, our motor coach drops us off for a tour of the Philadelphia US Mint, the first US Mint in the United States established in 1792. Coins have been continuously struck here for over 200 years. Our day continues in the Independence Mall area, sometimes referred to as "America's most historic mile in the making of America". Stops and visits are included at the National Constitution Center, Betsy Ross Home, Liberty Bell, Franklin Court, and the Franklin burial site. This evening we gather at City Tavern for an included dinner, where servers in period dress serve up old-fashioned fare. After dinner, we are accompanied by a "colonial visitor" to Independence Hall, where we "sneak" into the Hall for an after-hours tour. We are entertained by eavesdropping on Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Ben Franklin as they discuss the Declaration of Independence. What a uniquely entertaining way to close out our day. *Included Meals: Breakfast / Dinner*

DAY 6

We enjoy an included breakfast at the hotel this morning before boarding our deluxe motor coach and traveling across Pennsylvania to the Stoystown/Shanksville, PA area. Here we visit the Flight 93 National Memorial, located at the site of the crash of United Airlines Flight 93, which was hijacked on September 11, 2001. The memorial was made to honor the crew and passengers of Flight 93, who stopped the terrorists from reaching their target. Later in the afternoon, we continue on toward Columbus, OH, where our rooms await us at the Hampton Inn East. *Included Meal: Breakfast*

DAY 7

Breakfast is included at the hotel before we continue our journey across Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois toward home. The miles roll by quickly as we visit with fellow travelers and share the many memories of the treasures that we encountered in Pennsylvania. *Included Meal: Breakfast*
